Focusing on the theme *Domestication of Populus and Salix: How far have we come, and how far do we still have to go?, the symposium will address topics dealing with poplar and willow genetics, genomics, physiology, pests & pathology, environmental applications and management applications.*

We welcome researchers, practitioners, regulatory and policy experts to help define what the challenges are and where we are going. The symposium will invite oral papers and posters; the opening dates for submission will be announced later in 2013.

The symposium lasts three days and will be held on the beautiful Campus of the University of British Columbia in Vancouver (BC), Canada. During the symposium there will be a spouses program to explore the beautiful city of Vancouver and its surroundings.



Post-conference tours:

Following the symposium, a one-day Field Tour will start at a young plantation of black cottonwood (*Populus trichocarpa*) at the University Campus and end in the eastern Fraser River Valley, approximately 100 km east of Vancouver. From there a three- or four-day Circle Tour will bring us to the beautiful Okanagan Valley, a dry and warm interior region in south central British Columbia, rich with beautiful lakes, rivers, grasslands, pine forests and vineyards, where we combine sightseeing with the business of poplars and willows in various applications.



Accommodation:

There will be accommodation available on Campus. Details will be listed on the IPS VI website later in 2013, when price schedules are finalized for 2014.

There will also be hotel accommodation available in Vancouver; details will follow later in 2013.
