Manchester, NH (MHT) 40 miles or 65 km from Durham Boston, MA (BOS) 60 miles or 100 km Portland, ME (PWM) 62 miles or 100 km New York (JFK) or (LGA) ~250 miles or 400 km

ACCOMODATION

There are several possible accommodation options in the nearby seaside town of Portsmouth (12 mi or 20 km from Durham, NH) for example: Hampton Inn & Suites, Residence Inn by Marriott, or Hilton Garden Inn all in Portsmouth Downtown, Holiday Inn Portsmouth or boutique hotels such as the Ale House Inn, The Hotel Portsmouth or the Sailmakers Inn.

In Durham, there is a Holiday Inn Express (20 rooms reserved) and Three Chimneys Inn (https://www.threechimneysinn.com/). The university will also offer suite style rooms with shared bathrooms at a very reasonable price: Single occupancy-\$58.00 per person, per night & Double occupancy-\$46.00 per person, per night & Linen package (one-time charge)-\$30.00

Guidelines for preparation of abstracts

The importance of forest diseases increases as global environments are affected by pandemics, invasive species and climate change. Scientists are encouraged to submit abstracts on research involving foliar, shoot, stem and rust diseases of trees as we deal with this dynamic environment. The workshop scientific program will be organized in oral and poster presentations. We invite all interested participants to submit abstracts for scientific presentations. Although we will try to accommodate as many presentations as possible, the Scientific Committee, will reserve the right to change your application from an oral presentation to a poster presentation where necessary if time constraints become a problem. A selection of papers submitted to the meeting will be published in a special issue of the journal Frontiers in Forests and Global Change. To present a paper or a poster, you must submit your completed abstract by February 2022 as an attachment to isabel.munck@usda.gov. Please indicate in your message whether your abstract is for an Oral Presentation or a Poster Presentation. All abstracts must be in Microsoft Word format, Font type and size: Times New Roman 12, Line spacing: single, scientific names in italics. They must indicate Title, Author(s), Address(es) of authors, E-mail of corresponding author. Please underline the name of the presenting author. An example of formatting requirements is included below.

Foliar, Shoot, Stem and Rust Diseases of Trees: An example of an appropriately formatted abstract.

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The abstract itself should not exceed 200 words. It should not include subheadings, Tables, Figures or references and preferably should be written as one paragraph. Spelling and grammar should conform to standard British-English usage. Authors are requested to have the abstracts properly revised if necessary. Abstracts will be published in hard copy in the Book of Abstracts.
