Review Papers, Research Articles, and Short Communications are invited under one or more of the following themes and questions:

Forward thinking on urban forests and urban greenspace after the pandemic.

For papers to be considered, COVID-19 should be a core theme of the presented study. Case studies are welcomed, but need to have a wider relevance, and their findings have to be related to the international state-of-art.
